HUGE MILESTONE ACHIEVED



PLAYGROUND UPDATE

Our playground division has been all over the state this summer working on a multitude of playgrounds! This summer IPS has hit a milestone of its own. As of June all team members of our division have been with Ideal for at least 5 years!







We have begun site work for the Lathrop City Park Unlimited Play project. Along with Unlimited Play, IPS will be building an inclusive playground for the city of Lathrop, MO. This project also includes a custom splash pad and covered stage for live music!



IPS will begin site work for the City of Raymore's Hawks Nest Project in late August. This nature-themed park features a fabulous treehouse, rock climbing wall, telescope panel and animal crawl tunnel that children of all ages are guaranteed to enjoy.

Over on the other side of the state, we have opened the KC Monarch's inclusive playground and installed the equipment at the new Central Bank's Sports Complex in conjunction with Unlimited Play & Variety KC.

Teaming with AB Creative, we have completed the full removal and installations at High Mount School in Swansea, IL, and the Franklin County Elementary School in New Haven, MO. In the next month, we will also be installing the St. Peter's Inclusive Playground following ILC's completion of the site work for IPS.

IRRIGATION UPDATE





High temperatures and little rain have kept our Irrigation Division BUSY! On top of keeping up with our clients, the Irrigation Division has taken on a few special projects.

In Brentwood at the Great Rivers Greenway project, a large irrigation project is underway. With 48 zones, 425 sprinklers, and 14,580 ft of PVC pipe, it will be 600 miles of greenways connecting St. Louis City, St. Louis County, and St. Charles County.

By the fall White Flag Church, in Oakville, will have a new irrigation system as part of an Ideal Landscape Construction project. The system will consist of 281 sprinklers, 24 zones, and 12,600 ft of PVC pipe.

With new projects and current customers, we have added a third utility van that is already stocked and on the road already making repairs.

SMART IRRIGATION MONTH - IMPROVING IRRIGATION FFFICIENCIES

Slow the flow - If water is applied too quickly, it can run off into the street or sidewalk. Smart irrigation regulates pressure, ensuring that the water has a chance to soak into the ground.

Don't think twice about smart upgrades - Take the guesswork out of irrigation by upgrading to a smart controller. Weather- and soil moisture-based controllers automatically adjust the watering schedule based on conditions at your location.

Select & inspect sprinklers properly - Select sprinkler heads and nozzles that apply water uniformly to the target area. Inspect your sprinkler heads regularly to make sure they are not obstructed or watering the pavement.

Work with a certified professional - Protect your investment

by working with a certified irrigation contractor. Certified professionals have demonstrated competence for the job to make sure it's done right.

Use drip irrigation - Drip or "low pressure, low volume" irrigation, applies water directly to the base or roots of plants. These systems are ideal for watering individual plants and smaller landscape areas slowly and precisely.

Save on your next upgrade - Many water utilities offer rebates for certain water-efficient products. Before upgrading to your new system, consult with your local water provider to see if they offer rebates in your area.

CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

This summer has kept our construction division busy with a variety of projects.

Construction at Ackert Park in University City was completed this week! Ackert Park's renovations began in early spring and included new ADA- compliant walkways, a splash pad, a sculpture park, and renovation of the 1900 trolley depot. Ideal Maintenance also installed rain gardens, extensive landscaping, signage, and irrigation.









Ideal Landscape Construction will be finishing up our work on Riparian Trail this month. Our work includes a one-mile asphalt-paved multi-use trail that will begin at August Hill Drive, continue through Central Park, cross Wild Horse Creek Road at the future Burkardt Place signal, and end at Old Chesterfield Road. A small parking lot/trailhead will be constructed at Old Chesterfield Road.

At Southview and Litzsinger School, ILC and IPS will be working together to bring the students two new inclusive playgrounds. ILC will be doing the site work to prep for the new playgrounds. Work will include retaining walls, slabs, fencing, grading, and demo. Site work will be done in July, making way for IPS to bring in the fun stuff!









ILC will be starting Phase Two development of Bluff View Park in Wildwood, MO. This 100-acre park site will include three components. The first component is improvements to the parking area and entry location that provides primary access to the park's trail system. The second component is to add new picnic tables and shade structures in the large island that is surrounded by the parking area. The last component of this park project is to improve access to the bluff area and provide limited seating at this one-of-a-kind location while also making it easier to maintain than its current condition.

In St. Charles, ILC will be doing a major bank stabilization project along Crystal Springs Creek. Our work involves constructing 1,074 ft of bank stabilization using rooted planting, native seed mix, and erosion control blanket on both sides of Crystal Springs Creek, downstream of Rio Vista Drive and South Fifth Street. The work includes building 2 retaining walls, replacing 3 storm outfalls, constructing 2,054 lf of sanitary sewer, and constructing 375 lf of water line.
